About the Licentiate in Ministry (LMin)

The 3-Year Licentiate in Christian Ministry is designed to equip students with the theological knowledge, practical skills, and spiritual formation necessary for effective ministry. The course will cover biblical studies, theology, church history, pastoral care, evangelism, and practical ministry, allowing students to prepare for various roles within the church and broader community.

5. **Community and Global Missions** - Understanding cultural contexts - Developing a mission mindset

6. **Conflict Resolution and Mediation** - Skills for managing conflict in ministry settings. - Techniques for mediation and reconciliation

5. **Thesis or Research Project** - Choose a topic of interest related to ministry - Conduct research and present findings - Integration of knowledge gained throughout the program
6. **Preparation for Ministry** - Vocational discernment and calling - Job search strategies and interview preparation - Networking and building professional relationships
